LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Your SLCT Board of Directors has been hard at work trying to make our Community Theatre a cooperative effort that adds value to all those who participate and enjoyment to the community we entertain. At the same time your Board has fiduciary responsibilities as a recognized 501(c) 3 non-profit entity to adhere to the "Articles of Incorporation", the Bylaws and our Policies and Procedures. In addition, we have been examining SLCT financials in consultation with the Lorie D. Blum, CPA, and CFP. The Board has established a workable budget that may help secure some grants down the road but more importantly will provide us with a better picture to view our revenue, assets, and expenditures from year to year. We have a performance schedule with potential directors that will take us through year 2015. We are also looking into our insurance coverage and trying to get some classes together for the upcoming year. We also serve as a sounding board for directors to discuss problems and solutions as they arise.

Since I mentioned directors I must give praise to Sandy Pallett and the entire cast and crew of "Polter-Heist" for their success and innovation in putting on a dinner theatre at two locations. For those who don't realize this a lot of "blood, sweat and tears" goes into a production. SLCT has so many talented people and more are being recruited thanks in part to our presence at all the "Open House" events. A holiday party on December 10th at Palo Verde is being planned so mark your calendars accordingly. More information is to follow.

As a Community Theatre we are trying to involve all the communities within the greater Sun Lakes area. These include but are not limited to dinner theatres at IronOaks; stage performance at Cottonwood; Improv at whoever wants us; Children's Theatre at Chandler Schools; and Reader's Theatre at the Renaissance. We are trying to reach out to all who wish to participate. That is why we are a **community** that transcends the obvious boundaries and boarders.

Sun Lakes Community Theatre Special General Membership Meeting Held at Cottonwood Meeting Room October 10, 2013

Opening Comments: Michael Carter opened the meeting with comments on theatre as a way to develop and nourish relationships and connections among people from within the entire Sun Lakes community.

Minutes: A motion to accept minutes from the March 14, 2013 meeting was made, seconded and approved.

Treasurer's Report: A motion to accept the Treasure's Report submitted by Kathy Jones was made, seconded and approved.

Entertainment: The cast of "Polterheist" presented a Snippet of the show through which all of the characters were introduced. Sandy Pallet, the director, introduced others who are working backstage.

Approval of Board Member: The membership approved the appointment of Grace Geisinger to the Board of Directors.

Education: It was announced that it is likely that there will be classes available in acting, set design and construction and technical aspects of theatre.

Spring Production: Penney Petersen will direct "Straight from the Horse's Mouth" to be produced in March 2014 with auditions to be held December 2013. She presented a brief synopsis of the play, casting requirements and introduced members who have already agreed to work backstage.

Children's Theatre: A touring group will present "Horton Hatches an Egg" to kindergarten and first grade classes in the public schools. Roger Edmonds, director, is looking for members who would like to act or help in some other capacity with the show.

Improvables: This improvisation group meets to practice and learn new skills, but they also have a great time while doing so. The Improvables have many performances lined up and the proceeds will go to SLCT.

Open Houses: SLCT will participate in three open houses. It's an excellent opportunity to recruit new members.

A & A: A question was raised about how the decision was made regarding the number of persons to be seated at each table at the dinner theatre production. Director Sandy Pallett explained that in consultation with Oakwood Food and Beverage it was deemed necessary to limit maximum seating to 10 per table to allow necessary room between tables for dinner service and movement of the actors.

Next meeting: The next meeting will be held November 14, 2013 with entertainment to be provided by the area High School Drama Departments.
