Last month I sang the praises of our Construction, Sound and Lighting Crews. This month a big shout-out goes to costumes, back and front of the house managers, props and make-up. No show can function without these valuable resources as well. So often we need to have costumes altered or made for our productions as the ones we have on hand just aren't right for the roles. A good example of this is the bellhop uniforms used in this July's production or soldier uniforms for the spring 2015 play. Make-up ensures that we don't look ghost-like as the spots hit our faces. Color is artfully added and shine removed in preparation for being seen under the lights. Props have the task of finding, making, borrowing or purchasing props used in the show. For What the Bellhop Saw there are 45 props not counting the furniture in the scene. And unless there is someone watching out to ensure all the actors are ready and things in place for each act, something could go wrong. Back of the house handles that task. They also cue lights and sound when the actors are ready to make their entrance at the beginning of each act and are responsible for notifying the front of the house when they can open up to the public at the beginning of the evening. Front of the house works on getting ushers, has assistive listening devices at the ready, handles the seats for the and ensures risers are up for seating. All are important behind the scenes roles in order to make a production a success. Are you getting the feeling that it takes a village to do a production? Yes, it sure does. Thanks for your work!
