Our **FALL 2017** play, **BEAU JEST**, written by James Sherman, a hilarious romantic comedy was a phenomenal hit Off-Broadway and became a movie in 2008! Directed by Carol Horowitz, the storyline centers around Sarah, a young, single Jewish woman with strong family ties, who is dating a non-Jewish man, Chris Cringle, who she fears will not meet with her very traditional parents' approval. So, she invents the "ideal" boyfriend to please her parents, a Jewish doctor no less! When they insist on meeting him, she employs an escort service to send her a Jewish date to pretend to be the boyfriend. Instead, they send Bob Schroeder, a non-Jewish aspiring actor who agrees to impersonate the perfect, "every-Jewish-Mother's-dream", Dr. Steinberg. As the zany, hysterically funny complications escalate, the outcome becomes increasingly unpredictable.
