Hello!

Thank you very much for your generous donations every year. We are proud to have you as a sponsor for our program. One of our major costs each year is providing the make-up necessary to create casualties for the Air Force Medical Field Day. The cadets are given training in emergency medical aid in a morning class and then are given the opportunity to attempt "real hands-on" aid to "casualties" that we provide. We average approximately 50-60 "injured" every year and create realistic looking wounds including shrapnel, burns, broken limbs,

amputations and serious blood loss injuries. This is a wonderful opportunity for both the technical and performing students to work in an environment beyond the staged productions.

The monies are also used to provide opportunities for students to direct one acts every semester. We have a night of Student-Directed Shorts twice a year and your donation helps fund the cost of the scripts, royalties and required props for these shows. 

FYI: **Basha's** has a gift card system in which SLCT would have to purchase a block of gift cards and then resell them to our members; we are not pursuing that program at the present time. Also, **Albertsons/Safeway** has a "community grant" program for which SLCT does not qualify.

"YOU'RE A GOOD MAN, CHARLIE BROWN"/



The grants committee is still searching for a chairman who, assisted by current committee members, will coordinate the search for new grants, donors, and sponsors.
