MINUTES OF SLCT GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING March 7th, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 6:30pm in the Saguaro Room at Cottonwood Country Club. Members commented that it was a wonderful room to hold general membership meetings due to having a smaller, more intimate size, better acoustics, and greater opportunity for socializing and camaraderie.

INTRODUCTION OF ELECTIONS:

- Jim Janowski organized the efficient elections process. Candidates were introduced: Howard Hummel, Jack Mitchell, Sandy Pallett, and Ray Texiera.
- After verifying that dues were paid, qualified members were given ballots to cast votes prior to the start of the business meeting.

BUSINESS MEETING:

- Phyllis Novy, President, called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm.
- Guests and new members were welcomed and introduced.
- The minutes of the February, 2019 General Meeting, as included in the Asides, were approved.
- The February, 2019 Financial Report was also approved. Dues are due!

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

 Carol Horowitz was called on to provide an update of grant submissions. However, before she could start her presentation, members of the newly formed ad hoc committee for grants surprised the audience by taking turns shouting out from all sides of the room: "I have a dream for SLCT!" as they also walked toward the front of the room, to join Carol.

The dream turned out to be an incredible grant opportunity to **WIN UP TO \$100,000 through the "A COMMUNITY THRIVES GRANT", a CHALLENGE GRANT, sponsored by Gannett Company, publishers of "USA Today" and the "AZ Republic".** Prior to Carol presenting the details of the grant, Howard Hummel, Rick Whitney, Sandy Pallett, and Greg Posniack took turns urging the membership to think about what a grant award of \$100,000 could do for SLCT!

Carol explained what a challenge grant was and that as a "Tier One" non-profit SLCT would have to raise \$3,000 in order to be eligible to compete for the top award of \$100,000. Additional awards would also be offered in the amounts of \$75,000, \$50,000, \$25,000, plus weekly bonus challenges awarded to organizations that raised the highest amount of donations during Weeks #1 and #3 and that had the greatest number of people donating during Weeks #2 and #4. Plus, SLCT would become eligible for local grant awards of organizational operating costs. Donations can only be made online at the ACT website and by credit card. Since ALL DONATIONS ARE TAX-DEDUCTIBLE, starting at \$10, and since SLCT gets to keep ALL funds raised, we can't lose!

The audience response was overwhelmingly supportive, and the room was overflowed with excitement! Questions were asked and answered. Before the presentation ended, Jim Nielsen started the donations campaign by making a \$1,000 challenge! Within moments, Judie Janowski, met his challenge and also pledged to donate \$1,000! Before the evening's end, thanks to additional pledges, we felt confident that by the start date of the grant, March 18th, we would have raised the initial \$3,000 requirement and would be eligible to compete for the top grant award!

Since the focus of the grant is "community building", SLCT can be very competitive! Our strength is that we are a COMMUNITY Theater that builds community by spanning the generation gap between seniors and younger generations. When SLCT performs Childrens' Theater for elementary schools, supports our high schools, does multigenerational improv performances, has multi-general audiences in our audiences of all main stage performances, and invites members and non-members to participate in our educational programs, we strongly demonstrate "building community".

The grant application provided an opportunity to fully describe our programs and our needs. Our request was to "help us find a home" and pointed out the challenges of seniors not having our own venue to rehearse, perform, store equipment, props and set items, or to build stage sets.

A strong plea was made asking the entire membership to donate their time and effort as well as to make donations. Everyone was asked to spread the word via social media. The donations window is from March 18th until April 12th. It is very important to obtain as many donations from different individuals as possible! To win, we need to show that SLCT has strong community support and that our community values what we do!

- Bill Becker reminded members of the fundraising initiatives that will result in SLCT receiving a percentage of each purchase back when members shop at Fry's Food Market and Amazon Smile! Jeanne Becker brought a laptop to help members register for both fundraising efforts!
- Since Merrie Crawford was not present, Phyllis Novy announced that auditions for "Plaza Suite", the Fall 2019 play, will be held on March 30th.
- Roger Edmonds announced that the Summer 2019 production of "Old Time Radio Show" will be held June 18th-22nd. The show will include scripts from three old radio shows. Auditions will be held during the end of April.
- Carol Horowitz announced that auditions for "You're A Good Man, Charlie Brown (Revival)", the Spring 2020 production, will be held on April 13th.
- Sandy Bocynesky announced that "Red Velvet Cake Wars" will be the Summer 2020 production.
