1. You're a Good Man Charlie Brown

You're a Good Man Charlie Brown is an adult Broadway musical show but is suitable for all ages: grandparents, parents, grandchildren, and friends with nostalgia for our younger days. The dinner-theater performances are at the Oakwood CC Ballroom; on Wednesday March 4, Thursday March 5 and Friday March 6, there will be a dinner at 6 pm and show at 7 pm; then on Saturday March 7, Sunday March 8 and Monday, March 9, there will be a matinee brunch at Noon with the show at 1 pm. The three dinner shows (Wed, Thurs, Fri) are \$38 per ticket with a full dinner, and the three matinee shows (Sat, Sun, Mon) are \$30 per ticket with wraps and salads served. Tickets are on sale electronically at www.slctinfo.com on Monday, February 10, 2020, and tickets are still available online 24/7 up to just before show time. Ticket sales are below expectations, and this is the last week for everyone to push to sell more tickets, so all SLCT members should please redouble your efforts to encourage your family, relatives, friends, and neighbors to purchase tickets for this terrific musical show.

2. Load-in, load-out for Charlie Brown

Part 1: SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 29 2-5 pm.

Oakwood has a lunchtime event in the three ballrooms, so we cannot start to bring in our equipment, risers, and props, etc. into **Ballroom C until 3 pm.**

- a. Meet at Price Road sheds at 2 pm to load lift-gate truck with risers, curtain bins, metal plates, poles, big props (doghouse, piano, stairs, etc.), painted flats, etc.
- b. Drive to Oakwood, and starting at 3 pm, place all items in Ballroom C.
- c. Oakwood has an evening event they have to set up for in the main Ballrooms A & B, so we must finish by **5 pm**, so they can set up for that one. We will store extra equipment in the Cactus realty box truck.

Load-in, Part 2: SUNDAY, MARCH 1

- a. Starting around 7 am, we will begin to set up the risers for the actors and the risers for the tech crew, plus position the painted sets and major props.
- b. At around 8 am, the tech crew will start to set up equipment for lighting and sound; our SLCT volunteers will help set up the poles and rig the black curtains, etc.
- d. We keep going until we're finished setting up the room.
- e. Then, Howard and the cast and crew can start a stage and tech rehearsal.

Load-out, strike: MONDAY, MARCH 9 After the show - appx. 3:15 to 5:30 pm.

Ashley wrote to Howard that all her maintenance people will be available to assist us move everything. She is moving Bingo from 5 pm to 6 pm, so the Oakwood people want to get the room ready for Bingo at around 5:30 pm.

Needed: All load-in people plus any SLCT volunteers, plus the Oakwood ballroom staff. Strike everything: remove curtains and poles, disassemble the risers, remove flats and large props, and move out all electronic equipment:

- a. Back to Price Road sheds (lift-gate truck) risers, curtain bins, metal plates, poles, big props (doghouse, piano, stairs, etc.), painted flats, etc.
- b. Tower Storage unit and Cottonwood (Cactus Realty truck) Deliver electronic equipment and costumes/small props to the unit where they are stored.

3. Donations to schools

This week, Roger Edmonds has been going around to the five Chandler High Schools awarding the drama directors the donations checks approved by the Board of Directors. Also, he has been addressing the drama students about the yearly \$1,000 scholarship and explaining the application rules and requirements. The students in all five schools have been invited to our *Charlie Brown* dress rehearsal on Tuesday, March 3.






I have just a few things to say.


