



What Your Mom Never Told You About Stage Lighting!

We are very fortunate to have the technology and equipment available to make stage lighting such an effective way to enhance a production!



But it wasn't always that easy to light a stage! The earliest known form of stage lighting was sunlight. As a matter of fact, the sun played such an extremely important role, that in order to establish a specific mood, actors paused plays and took an intermission until the sun's angle suited the need for the scene!

The early Grecian theaters were built facing east to west, so that in the afternoon plays were performed to take advantage of the natural sunlight hitting the actors. Even then early Greek plays featured lighting cues! Because the plays



took place outside, stage companies had little control over lighting. Even still, the innovative Greeks, used large mirrors to alter or reflect the sun's rays and black curtains were used to represent night!




Our Benefactors
